Inspired by events in the life of Miles Davis, this is a wildly entertaining, impressionistic, no-holds barred

portrait of one of 20th century music's creative geniuses. In the midst of a dazzling and prolific career at the forefront of modern jazz innovation, Miles Davis virtually disappears from public view for a period of five years in the late 1970s. Alone and holed up in his home, he is beset by chronic pain from a deteriorating hip, his musical voice stifled and numbed by drugs and pain medications, his mind haunted by unsettling ghosts from the past. A wily music reporter, Dave Braden, forces his way into Davis' house and, over the next couple of days, the two men unwittingly embark on a wild and sometimes harrowing adventure to recover a stolen tape of



the musician's latest composition. By the late 70s, plagued by years of regret and loss, Davis flirts with annihilation until he once again finds salvation in his art. Working from a script he co-wrote with Steven Baigelman, Cheadle makes his bravura directorial debut. Stars Don Cheadle, Ewan McGregor, Emayatzy Corinealdi and Lakeith Lee Stanfield. 
